7th Annual Peace Day Celebration in Woking

Over 300 children entered the annual Peace Day Competition organised by Woking People of Faith in partnership with Surrey Faith Links.

This year’s theme marked the 800th anniversary of the encounter between Saint Francis of Assisi and Sultan Malik Al Kamil during the 5th crusade. Children were asked to write a poem or design a poster on how that meeting could be a blueprint for world peace.

Children from New Monument Primary school enjoyed performing a play about the meeting between the Saint and the Sultan. It portrayed a powerful message; to put differences aside and focus on what unites; to listen and learn from one another and respect people of all faiths and backgrounds to establish peace.

Kauther Akhtar, Faith Links Adviser, gave a background to International Day of Peace—it is the 20th anniversary of Peace Day and the 7th year since it has been held in Woking.

Simon Trick, Chair of Woking People of Faith (WPOF) spoke about the interfaith forum and how to get involved.

A group of Children from Shah Jahan Mosque sang a nasheed (Islamic song) followed by Mike Cope, a member of Christ Church, who sang a couple of anti-war and pro-peace songs.

The Mayor of Woking, Cllr Beryl Hunwicks spoke about Woking as a diverse and welcoming Borough; she then presented the prizes to the winners of this years Peace Day

competition.

Free henna painting of peace symbols was also available throughout the event. There was a display of books and resolutions about Peace run by Irene Ridgeon from Woking Action for Peace.

12 years to save the planet?

South East England Faith Forum's 2019 Annual Conference examined faith, belief and non-faith perspectives on climate change, and the influence and impact that faith and non-faith groups can and should have on the future of our planet.

The Conference opened by the SEEFF Chair Kauser Akhtar. Kauser invited the audience to a few minutes of silence to remember Charles Wallach, the Jewish member of SEEFF Board of Directors who recently passed away.

Speakers included: John Paul DE Quay from the Ecological Conversion Group, John Marder, Interfaith Officer for Network of Buddhist Organisations UK, Kamal Preet Kaur from the Sikh Missionary Society UK, Jeremy Rodell, Dialogue Officer for Humanists UK, Rabbi Jeffrey Newman, Founder of Shema and Emeritus Rabbi of Finchley Reform Synagogue, Kamran Shezad, director of Training for the Islamic Foundation for Environmental and Ecological Sciences (IFEES) and Dr Justine Huxley, the CEO of St Ethelburga's.

Christian Muslim Forum

Bishop Andrew Watson hosted the Christian Muslim Forum on 11th September 2019; Muslim and Christian representatives looked at the historic encounter between Saint Francis of Assisi and Sultan Kamil Al Malik and discussed principles that could be drawn out from this relationship.

Contemporary issues were discussed such as Kashmir, the link between the Diocese of Guildford and Diocese of Sialkot (Pakistan), the 25th anniversary of the massacre of Srebrenica, Bosnia and local interfaith engagement.

The forum will continue to meet regularly to improve Christian Muslim relations in Surrey and surrounding areas.



Surrey Environment Partnership

The Surrey Environment Partnership (SEP) is made up of Surrey County Council (SCC) and the 11 district and borough councils in the county. It aims to manage Surrey's waste in the most efficient, effective, economical and sustainable manner.

The 11 district and borough councils are waste collection authorities (WCAs) and are responsible for the collection of Surrey's municipal waste which includes waste from households. The county council is the waste disposal authority and is responsible for the disposal and treatment of Surrey's municipal waste collected at the kerbside and waste and recycling from Surrey's community recycling centres (CRCs).

Attendees then enjoyed a diverse range of food, which was brought in by those attending from various cultures.

The Diocese of Arundel and Brighton organised a 'Dialogue and Unity Day' focusing on Catholicism and Islam.



Over 80 people attended this event held at the St Philip Howard Centre for Education, Crawley on Saturday 28th September 2019.

Fr Martin McGee, a newly appointed Inter Religious Adviser for the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton spoke about his experience in Algeria, the relationship between the Monks of Tibrhine in Algeria and the Muslim community. Fr Martin mentioned a number of Church documents including an address given by Pope Saint John Paul II ([available online here along with his talk](#))

Kauther Akhtar, Surrey Faith Links Adviser, delivered a talk about Islam, she explained the teaching and example of the Prophet Mohammed (pbuh) with regard to interfaith dialogue, [available here](#) and [listen to the full speech here](#).

Festival of Cultures

Despite the rainy day, we were delighted to welcome so many people of different cultures of SMEF. People of all ages and ethnicities came together to showcase their cultures with food, song and dance. The large hall at Ravenscote Junior School in Camberley was set up with stalls selling food, artefacts and cultural displays. The Mayor Cllr Robin Perry opened the event and distributed prizes to children of different age ranges who had taken part in SMEF's 'I live in Surrey' art competition.



This was followed by a delightful program of song and dance. Graceful Nepali women from the Camberley Nepali Society and the Woking Nepalese Community Services swayed to music celebrating nature and love. Four little girls from the Sayapatri Cultural Club won our hearts with their Nepali dance moves. Krisztina Paladi-Kovacs, a Trustee of SMEF and a dance teacher led her troupe of boys and girls in their national costume, entertaining the crowd with their energetic and rhythmic Hungarian folk dance. Our Bahai member groups ran a story telling session for children on the birth of the BAB, the founder of the Bahai faith. The Chinese Association led by Anita Ho also a SMEF Trustee did a graceful Tai Chi display and a sword dance. Nayayuva's young Nepali volunteers displayed their virtuosity on the guitar accompanied by a tuneful melody. Zareena Linney from Youthbox accompanied by her group of boys and girls did a Boxercise demo. The show ended with a Kathak dance performed by Marcina Arnold, from the Indian community, who convinced people to come to the floor and learn a few moves, ending our Festival of Cultures event on a happy note.

Surrey Education Fund

The Surrey Education Fund provides funding to help disadvantaged children and young people up to 25 years to access education and training.

Grants are awarded to fund costs such as equipment, books, travel or tuition fees or support the costs of providing charitable educational facilities. Funding is also available for voluntary or charitable projects that provide training and skills development.

Are you Brexit Ready?

Please see below a message from Surrey County Council about Brexit:

"With the October 31st deadline for leaving the EU looming, residents, the voluntary sector and businesses are being urged to check whether they are ready for Brexit. The County Council is following government advice and has been planning for some time to ensure we are prepared, working with multi-agency partners like the Police, NHS, Highways England and Surrey Chamber of Commerce to help keep Surrey safe, moving, and preventing and minimising any impact of disruption to communities, traffic and the environment.

There are an estimated 78,000 EU nationals living in Surrey who can apply free of charge for settled or pre-settled status. The [step-by-step process](#) is applicable for all EU citizens living in the UK who have a valid biometric passport. It is also open to non-EU family members with a valid biometric residence card. The deadline for applying is 30th June 2021, or 31st December 2020 if the UK leaves the EU without a deal.

Businesses and all relevant organisations should also check they have the correct documentation and procedures in place to continue trading without any hitches once the UK has left the EU. This will apply, for example, to companies involved in any import or export activity to and from the EU. The farming community and agricultural businesses need to check whether any special measures will apply to them surrounding animal movements, for instance, or other regulatory procedures.

The Government has launched its own information campaign [Get Ready for Brexit](#) which contains all the information for residents, families, businesses and organisations, ranging from what's needed to take the family car on holiday to the EU, to a fact-checker for ex-pats living abroad. 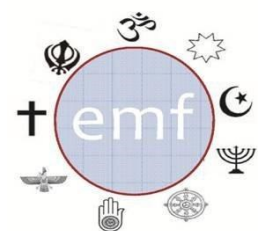

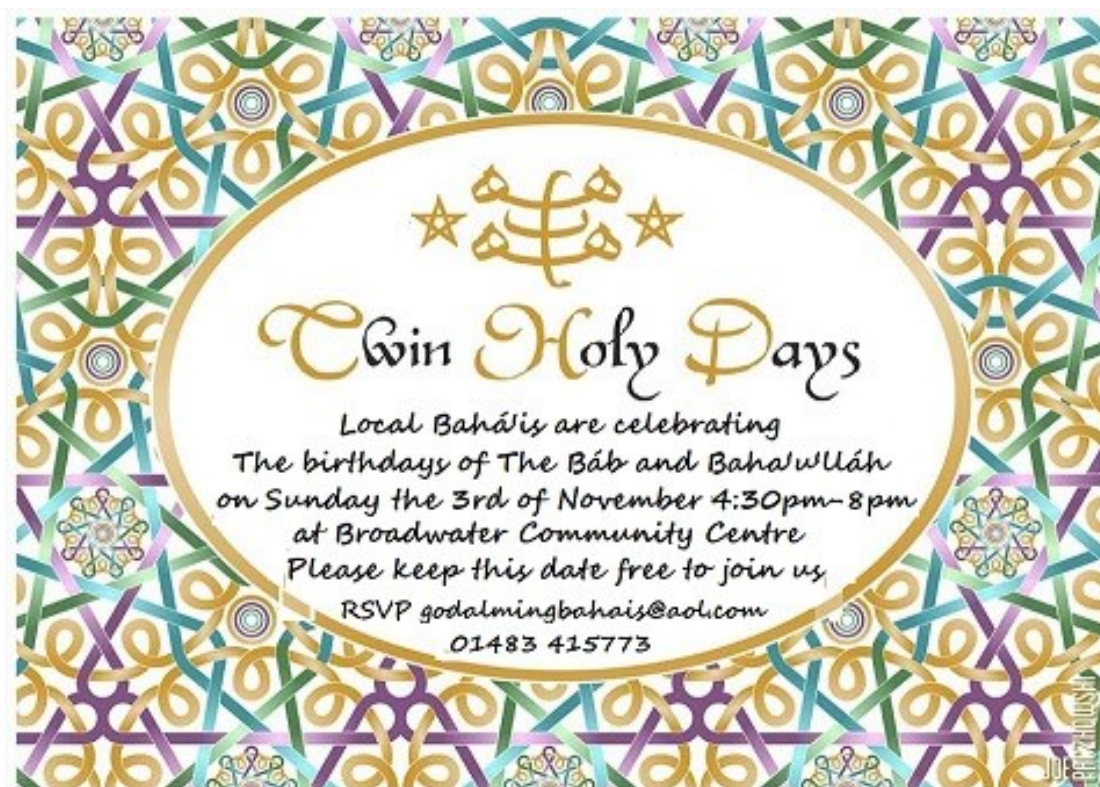
