**Festival Time!**

April was a very multi faith month which saw an overlap of many faith festivals, and it occurs after every 33 years!

Japanese Buddhists had Hanamatsuri on 8th April, Mahayana flower festival to celebrate the Buddha Shakyamuni’s birthday

Jains had Mahavir Jayanti on the 14th April where they celebrated the birth of Lord Mahavir, the last Tirthankara (saviour).

Sikhs had Vaisakhi on the 14th April to mark the creation of Sikhism and the ordination of the Khalsa.

Christians had Easter from 15th-19th April where the death and resurrection of Jesus was marked.

Jews had Passover from 16th – 23rd April to celebrate the Exodus, the freedom from slavery of the Children of Israel from ancient Egypt that followed the Ten Plagues

Hindus had Hanuman Jayanthi on 16th April when the birth of Hanuman was

commemorated.

Zoroastrians had Adar Mah Parab on the 21st April, when the birthday of fire was celebrated.

Baha'i have Ridvan from 21st April—2nd May, which is the most important Baha'i festival when Baha'u'llah declared himself the Promised One, prophesied by the Bab. It is during this period that Baha'is elect all their governing bodies.

Muslims have Ramadan from 2nd April- 2nd May, which marks the most significant month in the Muslim calendar as they fast daily from dawn to sunset.

### **DBS launches a new customer webchat service**

The Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) launched a new webchat service on 25th April 2022.

The webchat service provides a way for customers to get answers to general questions in real time from customer service staff, without having to call the customer contact centre.

The service will operate Monday to Friday, 10:00am to 4:00pm, and is available to answer general customer questions to anyone completing a task such as applying for a DBS check, making a barring referral, or logging into the Update Service.

If you're thinking of organising a street party or an event you will need to submit an application. This is not done via Surrey County Council but via your local district and borough council. If you need to apply for a road closure please allow 6-12 weeks before your event. See the District and Borough links on page 8 of this newsletter to submit an application in your area.

**Big Lunches**—The Big Lunch is an idea from the Eden Project to bring people together to meet, chat and have fun in their neighbourhoods, annually fundraising £8m for local causes they care about. It's about sharing food and fun during the Jubilee bank holiday weekend of 2 to 5 June 2022, or throughout the Month of Community in June as we celebrate good causes across the UK.

## Government sets out next steps for living with COVID-19

The Government has set out the [next steps for living with COVID](#) and has announced who will be able to access free COVID tests following the halt to the universal testing offer for the general public.

Free tests will continue to be provided to people who are at risk of serious illness from COVID-19, and eligible for treatments, to use if they develop symptoms. NHS and adult social care staff will also continue to get free tests, along with those in other high-risk settings.

There are national plans in place to implement a rapid testing response should a new health threat emerge, such as a variant of concern. Vaccines and anti-viral treatments will enable the country to manage COVID in the same way as other respiratory infections.



### Talks at Surrey History Centre

**Saturday 23rd April** (14:00 to 15:30): Roots & Routes: On the history of minority burial grounds in Brookwood Cemetery (Part I). Based on an outline of 19th Century demographic development and legislative reform, the talk will explore how Brookwood Cemetery emerged as 'host' to the highest concentration of minority burial grounds in the UK. The talk will then turn towards the defining features of some of the burial grounds, including the Zoroastrian, Swedish and Latvian plots.

**Saturday 14th May** (14:00 to 15:30): Roots & Routes: On the history of minority burial grounds in Brookwood Cemetery (Part II). The second talk will trace cultural and religious roots of some of the burial communities in Brookwood Cemetery and also trace the routes taken by these communities, in particular the East African connection. There will be particular focus on the settlement and burial practices of Woking-based Pakistani- and Italian-heritage communities.
