
Circuit Mission Day

Circuit Meeting – September 2018

The circuit meeting met at Trinity Methodist Church Woking on Thursday 20 September. Carol attended as the representative from our church, Linda attended in her capacity of Senior Circuit Steward.

This was the first circuit meeting presided over by Rev Keith Beckingham. The longest point of business was the item concerning the Circuit Treasurer. Roger Stickland, who has been the circuit treasurer since the Wey Valley Circuit was formed in 2016, moved to Devon last year but agreed to continue in post until December 2018. That date is rapidly approaching and the Circuit has yet to secure a replacement. It is not only a vital role but also a very onerous role: it deals with the large budget of our Circuit, manages the Grants awards, complies with the demands of HMRC and the Charity Commission, ensures that staff – both Lay and Ordained – are remunerated appropriately and in a timely manner. And this is volunteer! Many people in the circuit have been approached to consider taking up this role but no one has discerned a calling to accept. The Circuit stewards were requested to go away and re think the issue and come up with a plan! Prayers are certainly needed for this challenge.

Due to the sad state of health of Nan McFarland of the Merrow congregation, Lyn Mackay – also from Merrow – was elected as a full representative to Synod with immediate effect; Lyn was previously the reserve. There is now a vacancy for a reserve: if you are interested please contact Jenny Jackson or speak to Linda. Representative synod meets twice a year in April and September on a Saturday somewhere in the South East District.

Nan is also relinquishing her role as deputy Circuit Safeguarding officer. She will be very much missed and we pray for her as her health deteriorates.

The church gifts, (ours is the stunning collage created by Carol and Claire) which were first exchanged at the circuit Inauguration service in September 2016 were once again exchanged, this item having been deferred from the Welcome Service due to time contraints. In 2016 our church was the custodian of the gift from Stoughton. In 2017 our church was the custodian of the gift from Guildford. For 2018 we are the custodians of the gift from Walton. It is on display on the Pulpit with an accompanying information sheet.

Following the sad loss to the circuit of Rev Paul Chesworth who retired in August due to ill health, the circuit is once again in stationing for a new presbyter for the Sheerwater and Woking churches. In line with process the Circuit stewards met with the leadership teams of both Sheerwater and Woking in August to discern the gifts and graces their congregations would like in a new presbyter. The profile was then compiled by the circuit team and has been submitted in good time to the district chair. The circuit will not find out until November whether or not a match has been made. Prayers are needed for this process and for both Sheerwater and Woking as they continue in faith with their individual Mission aims.

Sheerwater will be supported during 2018 by Rev Peter Hills (Methodist) and Rev Gillaine Holland (Anglican) and whilst Rev Keith Beckingham will retain pastoral oversight of Trinity, both Rev Allan Taylor and Rev Barrie Tabraham will assist with Pastoral and Sacramental cover.

Rev Claire Hargreaves, who retired from full time ministry in August, is now the District Refugee and Inter faith links officer. Claire will continue with all her active work with refugees in the South East Methodist District. Claire is continuing her participation with the Wey Valley Circuit Mission Group and we have her to thank particularly for the Circuit Prayer diary.

Rev Keith Beckingham proposed that the morning service on Sunday 30 December be a circuit service at Merrow Methodist church. Keith will lead the service, giving his colleagues a much needed free Sunday and also relieving the pressure on church stewards/musicians etc. when many churches have several services on 23/24/25 December. The meeting voted overwhelmingly to accept this proposal. *N.b closer to the time we will organise transport to Merrow for those who wish to worship on that Sunday*

The meeting closed at 10.20 pm


