**Friday 1st 'Time out 1'-** Jesus took time out with the disciples and, referring to perseverance in prayer, Jesus said – 'Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. How much will your Abba Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask. (from Luke11:5-11)

**Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> 'Time out 4': The Transfiguration of Jesus** (Matthew 17:1-13. Mark 9:2-13, Luke 9:28-36 HP 259,260,261) Jesus took time out with Peter, James and John away from the crowd on a mountain and showed them his power and purpose. Take time today to reflect on what it means to you.

**Thursday 7**th Find a quiet spot with a view, or a picture, and reflect on these words, as a prayer:

O Lord, my God, when I in awesome wonder consider all the works your hand has made, I see the stars, I hear the mighty thunder, your power throughout the universe displayed.

**Monday 11**<sup>th</sup> 'Time out 5': Jesus says, 'Come and gather round, I want to teach you my friend some truths about the love I bring, the love that never ends. (from HP510 v 1a Leith Fisher)

Speak in the stillness, Lord I pray, come to my heart and meet me here. Bring me your peace for each new day – a gift of grace to earth from heaven. (From StF 511 v1 Gareth Hill)

**Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup>** When, in the anxious rush of days, I lose my hold on faith and you, reclaim me with your calm embrace – a gift of grace to earth from heaven, so may I be renewed in love, held and sustained by you alone. Strengthened by you that I may prove a gift of grace to earth from heaven, (*Ibid v5*)

**Wednesday 13**th Pray for the Ministry and Mission of Pop-Up Play Café 09.30-11.30am at St Mary's Guildford – Free - space to play – time to relax – coffee and cake - all ages welcome!

**Thursday 14**<sup>th</sup> Pray for the Ministry and Mission of Chaplaincy across the Circuit; in Schools, the University, Colleges, Hospitals, Care Homes, and MP Send. For chaplaincy work with families and those who serve and work in caring for the community. That the Holy Spirit may enable, strengthen and support them. Amen.

**Friday 15<sup>th</sup> The Blessed Virgin Mary** 'God sent his Son, born among us of a woman, under the conditions of the law so that we might be redeemed. Thus, we have been set free and fully adopted as God's own children through the Spirit of his Son, into our lives crying out 'Abba Father! **Friday 22<sup>nd</sup>** Lord, hold me close, let your love surround me; draw me near to your side. And as I wait, I'll rise up like the eagle, and I will soar with you, your Spirit leads me on in the power of your love. (*Ibid*)

**Sunday 24**<sup>th</sup> Pray for the Worship, Ministry and Mission **at** Woking Trinity 10.30am English speaking Congregation, 1.30pm Chinese speaking Congregation, Foundry Worship 6.00pm, and all who participate.

**Monday 25**<sup>th</sup> **St Bartholomew also believed to be Nathanael (**1 John 45-51) Eusebius states Bartholomew went on a missionary tour to India, after that to Mesopotamia, Parthia Lycaonia, Ethiopia and Armenia where with Jude they introduced Christianity. Tradition records that he was martyred there. Give thanks for the work of Batholomew in spreading the Gospel. Pray for the gift of the Holy Spirit to enable to share your faith in words and deeds.

**Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> Circuit Pilgrimage to Iona 28<sup>th</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> September–** Pray for those who are undertaking this pilgrimage and will be preparing practically and spiritually, that God will bless them.

**Wednesday 27**<sup>th</sup> Pray for the Pilgrims who commence their journeys today for- journeying mercies, good fellowship and a comfortable night tonight and a safe arrival tomorrow evening.

**Thursday 28**<sup>th</sup> Pray for the Ministry and Mission of Coffee and Cake at St Mary's Guildford 10.30 – 12 noon, where people can meet and have fellowship together.

Friday 29<sup>th</sup> John the Baptist execution - 'Time Out 7': Reflect on these words of John the Baptist, 'Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise' I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit (from Luke 3).

And Jesus the 'Son of Man - Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you, ... for I was hungry, and you gave me food, thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger, and you welcomed me, I was naked, and you gave me clothing, I was sick, and you took care of me, I was in prison, and you visited me. (From Matthew 25:34-36)

**Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> As we approach 1<sup>st</sup> September –** Prayerfully reflect on the above words with these words from the Covenant Service – *I am no longer my own but yours. Your will, not mine be done in all things, wherever you may place me, in all that I do and in all that I may endure; where there is work for me and where there is none; when I am troubled and when I am at peace. Your will be done when I am valued and when I am disregarded; when I find fulfilment and when it is lacking; when I have all things, and when I have nothing. I willingly offer all I have and am to serve you as and where you choose.* 

**Sunday 31**st Give thanks and pray for the Ministry and Mission of all our Ministers, Local Preachers, Worship Leaders, Pastoral Visitors, Stewards, Administrators, Musicians, Readers, Flower Arrangers, Refreshment Providers, any other Volunteers, and all those who Worship in the Churches or Online, including yourself. Amen.
