Last month, I achieved a long-term goal of mine: to visit the Sagrada Familia, the renowned basilica in Barcelona, Spain.

Interestingly, I have been referencing this church in my sermons for over a decade, despite having only seen a few pictures online. Finally, I gained firsthand experience of this magnificent building that I have often cited as an example of faith.

You are likely more familiar with the basilica than I am: designed by Antoni Gaudi, its construction began in March 1882 and has continued almost continuously for the last 142 years. When questioned about the lengthy construction period, Gaudi famously responded, "My client is not in a hurry."

What I find both fascinating and inspiring is the foresight involved from the start, knowing it would take over a century to complete. The architect who meticulously designed each carving and the workers who poured the concrete or set the stones knew they would not see the finished project. They worked not for themselves but for future generations.

Imagine if our churches adopted this forward-thinking approach, making decisions not for ourselves but for our children and grandchildren. What would our world look like if climate decisions were made with the same long-term perspective?

We can often be shortsighted, but we serve a God who is eternal. God cares not only for the church today but also for its future, indefinitely. We should aim to build a church that will continue to honor God for centuries to come.
