Dear Friends

Is it just me or does the world seem to you to have gone a little crazy recently? I'm really worried that we have lost sight of the difference between truth and lies. We believe things that we are told from unreliable sources because they match the narrative that we want to be told.

A good example of this happened last week when weather forecasters in America started receiving death threats because of hurricane Milton. Large numbers of conspiracy theories had started circulating online that the strength of the hurricane had artificially been altered by the federal government who clearly wanted somehow to do damage to the people of Florida in the build up to the November US election.

This was not only a dangerously violent reaction to weather forecasters who were just trying to give important information, but it put the lives of rescue workers and Florida residents at risk as people ignored government advice.

In this country during the summer, we had another example of this as a tragedy at Southport was distorted by online rumours that fuelled paranoia and caused rioting and widespread lawlessness.

There are far too many people who get their news from unreliable or biased sources. The BBC has spent large amounts of money setting up a 'verify' unit to check the facts of stories which are reported on their news broadcasts. In an age of connectivity, our sources of news are too often in the hands of wealthy billionaires, or corporations, or hacked by overseas countries with their own agendas about the stories that we see.

The truth has never been more important - and that is not the story which you agree with most closely - it is the one that tells you the ACTUAL truth.

Jesus once said that 'the truth shall set you free'. It is a sadness to me that we have never been surrounded by so many people who only seem to have a nodding acquaintance with the truth.

We need to be people of the truth. People of grace and peace, and hope and love. That means we need to be wary of people (particularly online) who have an agenda that they want to push or an extreme opinion that they want to press on us, or sometimes people who just tell us what we want to (rather than 'ought' to) hear.

Friends - the truth is a precious thing and is worth searching out and holding onto. In this crazy world let us try to do that - in Jesus' name.


