Dear Friends,

I have a very clear memory of being present at an evening service led by a friend, Rev. Stanley Hall, one time missionary in Sierra Leone. Although it was many years ago, I still remember the text he preached from: 'A wandering Aramean was my father'. It's a text from the book of Deuteronomy 26:5. I felt then, as I feel now, that it is a simple but an intriguing text. It reminds us that the Christian-Judeo traditions are built on the stories of wandering and persecuted peoples. The full text reads: 'A wandering Aramean was my father who went down to Egypt and lived there with a small band of people.' The lifechanging experience of Abraham, the founding patriarch of the people of Israel, is one of leaving his home country at age 75 to seek out an unknown land that God will show him. Later, Abraham and his family have to escape famine and so travel on further to Egypt. It's a story that is echoed in the experience of Jacob and his sons, who also have to travel to Egypt to escape famine and where they are given work and a new home. And of course, the Holy Family also had to flee to Egypt to escape the murderous intent of Herod. Later, early Christian communities knew what it was like to suffer at the hands of hostile neighbours and unhelpful authorities.

This week is Refugee Week and Friday is World Refugee Day. According to the UN Refugee Agency there were 42.7 refugees in the world in 2024. So many men, women and children with no place to call home, reliant on the kindness and generosity of strangers, often desperately short of food and clean water, no chance to work, no proper medical care, no education for the children. We cannot even begin to imagine the horror of it all day after day, week upon week, months passing into years.

Anna Briggs, a long-time member of the Iona community wrote a hymn beginning:

We lay our broken world In sorrow at your feet, Haunted by hunger, war and fear, Oppressed by power and hate.

Where human life seems less Than profit, might and pride, Though to unite us all in you You lived and loved and died.

Words particularly appropriate for Refugee Week and words we might use as a prayer.
