Dear Friends,

Now of course you don't have to agree with me on this, but I get slightly tired by the way some people use the word 'woke'. First of all, it's not a word I would want to use about any person or action, but there are lots of people who love to use it. When I hear it being used it's normally to describe a huge range of things that the person using it doesn't like.

In fact, it's a word that's become weaponised by certain groups of people to describe pretty much anything that they find difficult about modern society. So, plays and TV dramas and the actions of companies or organisations are condemned for being 'woke'. What has usually happened is that a story or action has been condemned for being aware that there are groups in society other than white males and that those groups may well have their own stories to tell and a need to see themselves represented in culture and literature.

An example recently has been the actions of the National Trust in terms of telling the important stories of the people who lived in some of the houses that they have in their care. I'm not quite sure what is wrong about the Trust being honest, for example, about how the family who lived in a huge mansion made their money. If a family made the majority of their fortune profiting from the slave trade, I think it is quite legitimate - indeed important for that story to be told.

Most of the time it seems to me that when people are criticised for being 'woke' what they are actually being criticised for is empathy and wanting to hear stories that have too often not been heard, or for wanting a variety of groups to be represented and their voices to be heard.

I am really not sure why anybody needs to be frightened by that - indeed it seems to me that it honours the rich variety of the world that God has placed us into and the love that is shared with EVERY person no matter who they are.

You won't find me using the word 'woke' because to me it has now become a word that is used in a negative way to entrench fear and 'otherness' - and perfect love drives out fear.


