As you know today is Ash Wednesday. When I was a small boy, I used to think that it had something to do with potato ash which was one of my favourite meals then...and still is to this day! Of course, Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, a day on which in some churches people are marked on the forehead, with ashes, with the sign of the cross. This marks their commitment to Jesus Christ and God, shows that they are sorry for the wrong things they have said and done in the past year and is a reminder that from dust we came and to dust we will return.

After being baptised by John in the river Jordan, Jesus went off alone into the wilderness where he spent forty days asking himself the question what it meant to be Jesus. During Lent, Christians are supposed to ask, in one way or another, what it means to be themselves.

Frederick Beuchner was an American Presbyterian minister and author, described as one of the truly great writers of the twentieth century. He suggested some of the questions we should ask ourselves during Lent and I would like to share those questions with you:

- 1) If you had to bet everything you have on whether there is a God or whether there isn't, which side would get your money and why?
- 2) When you look at your face in the mirror, what do you see in it that you most like and what do you see in it that you most deplore?
- 3) If you had only one last message to leave to the handful of people who are most important to you, what would it be in twenty-five words or less?
- 4) Of all the things you have done in your life, which is the one you would most like to undo? Which is the one that makes you happiest to remember?
- 5) Is there any person in the world, or any cause, that, if circumstances called for it, you would be willing to die for?
- 6) If this were the last day of your life, what would you do with it?

Fred Beuchner concludes: To hear yourself try to answer questions like these is to begin to hear something not only of who you are but of both what you are becoming and what you are failing to become.

All in all, it can be a pretty depressing business, but if sackcloth and ashes are at the start of it, something like Easter may be at the end.
