

Dear Christian friends,

Long before ministry found me, I was an 11-year-old boy singing country and pop classics in nightclubs and pubs across Ghana. Cliff Richard, Jimmy Cliff, the Beatles, the Everly Brothers, ABBA, James Brown, and the Seekers. Music shaped my imagination early, and even now, certain songs still speak to my faith.

Two of them, The Sound of Silence and Bridge Over Troubled Water by Simon & Garfunkel, continue to offer surprising spiritual insight, even though they were never written as hymns.

### **The Sound of Silence**

This song describes a world where people speak without listening and hear without understanding. Silence becomes a barrier instead of a blessing. As Christians, we know silence can be holy, but it can also hide fear or indifference. The challenge is to listen with compassion and speak with grace, breaking the silence that prevents healing.

### **Bridge Over Troubled Water**

Here we hear a promise of comfort: When life overwhelms you, I will be your bridge.

This mirrors the gospel. Jesus is our bridge in sickness, trials, loneliness, joy, and triumph. And He calls us to be bridges for others to stand with the weary and offer hope when waters rise.

### **Stepping Beyond Comfort**

Both songs remind us that comfort zones can quietly limit our discipleship. Silence is comfortable. Avoiding troubled waters is comfortable. But growth happens when we dare to listen more deeply, love more boldly, and trust God in unfamiliar places. May we, as the Wey Valley Circuit, live this courage together.

### **Four Reflections**

Silence becomes holy only when it leads us to compassion.

A bridge is a gift of grace built for someone else to cross.

Troubled waters cannot drown us when Christ is our companion.

When words fall short, love becomes the clearest song of all.





