

Friends of the Wey Valley Circuit,

For the past few months, I have been serving as Interim Moderator for two local congregations of the United Reformed Church. It's not as glamorous as it sounds (if it even does sound glamorous). Basically, I'm assisting these two churches in preparing their profiles in order to call a new Minister. It is a time of uncertainty for these Christians, and it has me thinking a lot about those "unsettled moments" that we all face.

After all, most of us like to know where we're going.

Whether we're planning a holiday, setting out on a journey, or simply driving somewhere unfamiliar, we feel more comfortable when we have a map, a sat-nav, or at least some directions. We like to know what lies ahead.

Life, however, rarely works that way.

There are seasons when the future seems uncertain. A change in circumstances, a difficult decision, concerns about health, family, work, or the wider world can leave us wondering what comes next. We find ourselves wishing for a clear roadmap. Yet faith has never really been about having all the answers.

The writer of Proverbs reminds us: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths" (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Notice what the passage does not say. It does not tell us that God will explain every detail of the journey before we begin. It does not promise complete certainty about the future. Instead, it calls us to trust.

Throughout Scripture, God often gives people a promise rather than a detailed itinerary. Abraham was called to leave everything familiar and go to a land that God would show him. The disciples left their nets and followed Jesus without knowing where the road would ultimately lead. Again and again, God's people are invited to take the next step before they can see the whole picture.

Perhaps faith is a bit like walking through thick fog. You cannot see the end of the road, but you can see enough to take the next few steps. God does not always illuminate the entire journey. More often, he provides sufficient light for today.

The good news is that our confidence does not rest in our ability to predict the future. It rests in the character of the God who holds the future. The promise of Scripture is not that life will be free from uncertainty. The promise is that God will be with us in the uncertainty.

As we face whatever lies ahead, may we find the courage to trust God with the next step, knowing that the One who has been faithful in the past remains faithful still.
