Friends of the Wey Valley Circuit,

I believe that I've used this space before to talk about my family's love of history. Part of our original motivation to move to the UK was this fascination with the long and storied history of this country. Over the weekend, we took a bit of a dive into the darker side of that history.

We attended a guided walk entitled "Disastrous London: Plaguepits, Executions, and the Great Fire". The tour guide began with leading us to the former site of Charterhouse School, and opened with the line: "You're standing above the graves of approximately 3,000 people."

We were then led to St. Bartholomew's Church, just outside of which are monuments marking the end of Wat Tyler's Peasant Revolt, the execution spot of William Wallace, and bomb damage from Zeppelin raids during World War I.

Finally, we walked south of St. Bart's Hospital (pointing out the spot marking where the Great Fire was stopped in 1666), to The Old Bailey, the spot of one of Europe's most notorious prisons, Newgate. Here, our guide pointed out that, while we think of public executions as something from the distant past, the nearby Barbican Tube Station opened in 1865, while executions were not private affairs until 1868. So, for 3 years, people were able to take the London Underground to see people be killed.

It was an interesting, yet sober, day. Everyone we've told about it has teased us for picking a "cheery" day out. Yet, I have no regrets. Usually when we go to London, we're seeing the Great and the Impressive. While it was somewhat depressing to be reminded of the city's darker side, it's sometimes helpful to be reminded of humanity's lows instead of always focusing on the highs. In fact, I think it can be downright necessary.

One thing I often see with new Christians, is that they are excited and joyful about starting out in church, yet as soon as something goes wrong in their lives, they lack that enthusiasm and disappear. I think our churches do a disservice to people when we're always focused on the happy and the cheerful. We need to prepare people for the darker moments of life...sometimes by staring those darker moments in the face.

Ultimately, that's what my family did this past weekend. We looked at the unpleasant past of our favourite city. We acknowledged that it's not a perfect place...but somehow, I think I love it all the more for that.

The Warm Homes Local Grant can be used to install insulation, upgrade doors and windows, install solar panels and upgrade your heating system to a heat pump, which is up to five times more efficient than gas central heating.

Eligibility criteria are:

- Household income of less than £36,000
- Or be in receipt of means-tested benefits
- And have an energy performance rating of D or below




Image of St Paul - Taken at Hosias Loukas, in the 11<sup>th</sup> century church


