*'Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God.; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. 'When I'm feeling down and sad, nothing much to make me glad, Lord, help me to remember you are there for me. When things seem so different, and very hard to understand, help me to remember you are close to me'.

**Thursday 29<sup>th</sup>** 'When no-one has time for me, nothing's like it used to be, help me to remember, you are still with me. When I'm crying deep inside, harder than I've ever cried, help me to remember, you are loving me'. (Ibid)

**Friday 30<sup>th</sup>** As we move toward Lent may God bless you, refresh you, protect you, direct you, cherish you, nourish you, encourage you and uplift you, day by day, as you walk with our Lord. (Abundant Blessings The Leprosy Mission Shop)
