# Responding to the reading:

Today's reflection comes from our friends and partners at All We Can – the international development charity.

Have you ever had unexpected guests at a meal time? Imagine having five thousand people turn up for Sunday lunch!

Perhaps with a bit more warning, the disciples might have put a financial plan in place; been saving a little bit each month and carefully preparing for this expenditure. But they didn't have any warning. Jesus knew that this large crowd were hungry and he wanted to meet their needs. It seemed a monumental ask. How could you feed all these people without enough money?

In this story, Jesus shows us how extraordinary things can happen. Jesus uses the ordinary gift of a simple lunch to do something extraordinary. Sometimes we can think of generosity as a calculation. It is a big act. It requires much from us. It will be costly. But the essence of this story is that all Jesus requires of us is our willingness to bring to him our ordinary offerings.

It is in Jesus Christ that the ordinary will be made extraordinary. This model of generosity is woven throughout the Bible. God takes ordinary people and uses them for extraordinary things. We, as ordinary as we are, are beckoned into relationship with the creator of the world. The one whose hands flung stars into space takes our hands and wants to walk with us.

Pause for a moment and think about your responses to these questions:

- Where in your life have you seen something extraordinary emerge from the ordinary?
- What are your hopes for your community or your local church: how can you see the extraordinary emerge from the ordinary things in your local area?

So, when we look at something as every day and ordinary, we can look at it through the lens of Jesus. This is the way All We Can works around the world – alongside and with the local communities they serve in parts of Africa. By listening to the local people and their needs, by using local resources and traditions, by working together and learning to listen, the ordinary can be become extraordinary.

Change begins when we work together, and a simple, ordinary thing is being turned into something extraordinary.

# **Prayers and Prayer Pointers for the Week**

# Monday 7th August

- Stand or sit in your kitchen for a moment. Notice the foods you can see, or think about the foods just out of sight in your cupboards, fridge and freezer. Think about where they have come from, and the people involved in getting them to you.
- Say a prayer of gratitude for what you have received.

# **Tuesday 8th August**

 Do you have a favourite poem or song? It doesn't have to be explicitly Christian. Consider the ways the good news of God is communicated through the words.

# Wednesday 9th August

- Hold a moment of stillness.
- Listen to yourself breathing.
- Calm yourself for a moment and offer this time to God. What do you need today?

### Thursday 10th August

- Every time you go in or out of the door to your house today, try to write a short prayer of thanks for something you are grateful for. You might like to write it down, or just say the words in your head.

# Friday 11th August

 What does the good news of the Gospel feel like to you? Can you express it as a prayer of thanks in just a sentence or two?

#### Saturday 12th August

- What does this summer hold for you? How has it been going so far? What do you need to offer to God?
- Spend a few minutes praying for the things that have been weighing you down or worrying you so far in this season. Offer your burdens to God.
